Humberside Police Safer Schools Partnership work with Bridlington and Headlands Schools

As part of our ongoing community outreach and Safer Schools Partnership work with Humberside Police, representatives from both schools met with the Police to discuss and agree further joint community work. As you are aware the Safer Schools Partnership work is focused around building and maintaining positive relations between young people and the police and between young people and the wider community- we feel strongly that as schools we must also play a key role in this together.

One of the real strengths of the partnership is when a police officer or police community support officer (PCSO) becomes part of the school community, building positive relationships with young people with the officer regularly being available on the school site to provide professional advice, on a one to one basis if requested, to students and staff. As a result, we are pleased to welcome at Bridlington and Headlands Callum Highland and Andrea Humphries as part of the team, students will become more familiar with them over the coming weeks- as they visit the sites more.

On Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> November, Bridlington School began an exciting new partnership to highlight the risks of underage drinking. Community Alcohol Partnerships (CAPs) are made up of partnerships between local authorities, police, schools, retailers, neighbourhood groups and health providers, working together to highlight the risks of underage drinking and improve the health and wellbeing of local children and young people. The Bridlington CAP will work with youth services and local organisations to provide alcohol-free activities for young people. It will also work with local schools to educate young people about underage drinking and ensure that they are equipped to make the right decisions about issues such as alcohol and drugs and anti-social and criminal behaviour.

Also on Thursday, a group of our students experienced a guided tour of Bradford Grand Mosque as part of our whole-school priority to provide our students with a wide range of rich cultural experiences. Thank you to Mr Kundi and Ms Ewing for organising this trip.

On Friday 25<sup>th</sup> November, the History Department took a group of Year 8 students to York to visit the city walks and York Dungeons. Thank you to Ms Rose for organising this trip.
