Exciting events:

We are developing a partnership with CU Scarborough, our local university. We have worked closely with CU Scarborough in the sixth form for a number of years and are expanding this partnership to the wider school. Next Friday Year 7 will be out of school all day doing study skills workshops at CU Scarborough.

Also, next Friday year 11 will be divided into two groups, those thinking of sixth form and those thinking of college or apprenticeships. The first group have an Academic Pathways assembly (delivered by Hull University) in period 1 followed by sixth form tasters in periods 2 to 5. Those thinking of college or apprenticeships will have a personal statements session in P1, a Vocational Pathways assembly (delivered by Hull University) in P2, an East Riding College assembly (further education and apprenticeships) in P3 and two hours working on the Log On Move On platform in P4 and P5.
