### Round Up and Super Successes:

#### Sixth form

This half term in sixth form the Year 13s will be looking at life skills and the Year 12s are being exposed to different career pathways. This week CU Scarborough came to discuss finance and budgeting with the Year 13s, advising them on how to manage money and had them complete a weekly budget for when they leave home. For the Year 12s, they had a talk from the Career Development Specialist from the NHS who spoken to our students about the different opportunities through the NHS and in particular the different routes available through apprenticeships.

Dr Kevin Corstorphine from the University of Hull delivered a lecture on The Great Gatsby for Y12 and 13 English Literature students to support their A-Level learning and give them a taste of what a university lecture is like.

#### Year 7 Sparks programme

Year 7 had their first session of the Hull University Sparks program on Thursday. Sparks is a program from the University of Hull designed to get KS3 and KS4 students informed about what higher education is, what you can study and the impact that can have on careers and employability. This is achieved through group work, and they have kindly opened this up to the entire year group for years 7 - 10.

#### Careers interviews

After interviewing all of years 9 and 11 before Christmas, the careers team's attention has changed to year 13. Almost all those interested in university have now submitted their UCAS forms with offers and interviews coming in thick and fast. Those not looking at university have had some great opportunities. Jack in particular has gone through many assessment centres with local and national accountancy firms.

#### Alumni mentoring

We've taken advantage of the strong links we have with our alumni recently with Simon Parker (Seven Architecture) doing a zoom call with Milita in year 11 looking at architecture careers and James Levitt (Fortus Accountancy) helping Jack in year 13 with accountancy interviews and assessment centres.

#### School Production

The Production auditions have gone really well. Over 80 students auditioned and we have included all of them in the cast. Rehearsals start next week. We can't wait to see our Bridlington School version of Chicago!
